





'For reasons that we don't know, few outsiders came to Cambodia at that time to try and ask why? It was almost as if the rest of the world wanted to forget us.

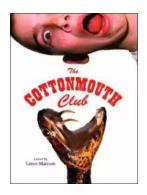

This book is a small attempt to put this right. Not to dwell on the past but not to gloss over it either.




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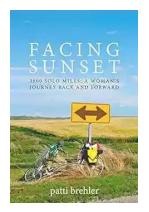
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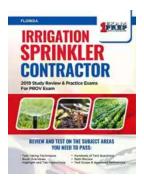
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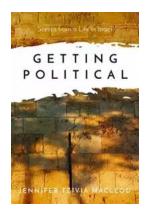
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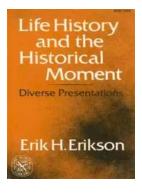
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
