



- 4. The verb "wagging" should be in the simple past tense "wagged" to match the tense of the sentence. Thus, the correct option is (a) "The dog's."
- 5. The verb "are able to" should be changed to "is able to" to match the singular subject "one." Therefore, the correct option is (c) "are able to."
