Than to love and be loved by me.

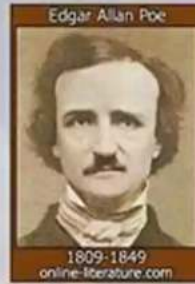
I was a child and she was a child,
