


- 1. Yarn over and insert the hook into the next stitch or chain space.
- 2. Yarn over and draw the yarn through the stitch or chain space (three loops on the hook).

- 3. Yarn over again and draw through the first two loops on the hook (two loops remaining on the hook).
- 4. Yarn over once more and draw through the last two loops on the hook. One double crochet stitch made.
- 5. Repeat steps 1-4 across the row.

Starting Your First Project

Now that you've mastered the basics, it's time to put your newfound skills into practice. Here's a simple beginner project to get you started: a dishcloth.

Materials:

- Medium-weight cotton yarn in the color of your choice
- Size G (4mm) crochet hook

Instructions:

- 1. Create a foundation chain of 31 stitches using the chain stitch (ch).
- 2. Starting from the 2nd chain from the hook, work a row of single crochet (sc) stitches across.
- 3. Turn your work and repeat step 2 until your dishcloth measures approximately 8 inches in length.
- 4. Finish off, cut the yarn, and weave in any loose ends using a tapestry needle.


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
